

## Statement

To whom it may concern,

Power Storage Europe B.V. declares that all pbq Valve Regulated Lead Acid (VRLA) Batteries comply to the following European Directives:

2006/66/EC on batteries and accumulators and waste batteries and accumulators and repealing Directive 91/157/EEC

2002/96/EC on waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE)

2002/95/EC on restriction of hazardous substances in electric and electronic equipment (RoHS)

The RoHS Directive aims to reduce the amount of hazardous waste generated by the types of electrical and electronic equipment covered by the WEEE Directive. To achieve this it bans the use above certain levels of some heavy metals and brominated flame retardants in new electrical and electronic equipment. The ban applies to all equipment placed on the market as of 1 July 2006.

This statement is also applicable on all pbq VRLA batteries in Flame retardant casing.
